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To Whom It May Concern:

In 1993 I had the privilege of meeting Myrna for the first time during a study visit with the Theological Faculty of Copenhagen to Syria. I had read about her in various magazines and was highly impressed with the message she had been conveying to the world, especially regarding the Unity of the Christian Church. Being a former Lutheran, converted to the Catholic Church, but feeling deep love for both, and having taught ecumenical theology for a number of years in Rome, this pledge for the union among Christians is very dear to my heart. In the message Myrna has received this urge for reconciliation among Christians is intensified as the Lord and his blessed Mother both make it pertinently clear to all that Unity is indeed one of the prime intentions of the Holy Spirit for the Churches in our time. The importance of this message is then further enhanced through the mysterious appearance of the wounds of Christ on Myrna when the Easter Dates coincide.

During Easter 2004 I visited Myrna again. This time with a team of Scandinavian scientists, both medical doctors, psychiatrists and technicians. The aim of the team was to be present and from a purely scientific perspective investigate and document what might happen again during Easter this year as the Easter Dates once more coincided. As is known, a wound appeared again, this time over her heart, followed by a moving message regarding Christ's pierced heart. Myrna and her family were amazingly cooperative. Their motto obviously was: There is nothing to hide. If they want to come, let them come. The results of the investigations are being analyzed and should later be made available to the public in the form of one or two articles.

This Easter of 2004 was indeed one of the most vivid experiences of Christian Easter, and how the Lord moves from crucifixion to resurrection, just as he wishes us all to enter more deeply into the mystery of his resurrection. I pray that the message and apostolate of Soufanieh may reach and strengthen many souls in search of the Peace, Love, and Truth of Christ.
